## Introduction

### **About the Podiatrists Registration Board**

The Podiatrists Registration Board has statutory responsibility for the registration of members of the professions; approval and monitoring of education and training programmes; establishing the code of professional conduct and ethics and standards of performance to which social workers must adhere to, and recognition of qualifications gained outside the State.

### **About CORU**

CORU is responsible for regulating health and social care professions. It comprises the Health and Social Care Professionals Council and the Registration Boards established under the Health and Social Care Professionals Act 2005 (as amended).

CORU's role is to protect the public by promoting high standards of professional conduct, education, training and competence amongst the designated professions.

The designated professions under the Act are clinical biochemists, counsellors, dietitians, dispensing opticians, medical scientists, occupational therapists, optometrists, orthoptists, physiotherapists, podiatrists, psychologists, psychotherapists, radiation therapists, radiographers, social care workers, social workers and speech and language therapists.



## The Public Consultation Process

### Background

The Podiatrists Registration Board Approved Qualifications Bye-Law is being amended to reflect the addition of the Degree of Master of Science in Podiatric Medicine (Pre-Registration), University of Galway, as well as the change in qualification awarding body for the Bachelor of Science (Podiatric Medicine), from the National University of Ireland, Galway to the University of Galway.

The following qualification title has been added to the draft Bye-Law:

- **Degree of Master of Science in Podiatric Medicine (Pre-Registration), University of Galway**

### Publicising the Consultation Process

A public consultation on the Podiatrists Registration Board Approved Qualifications Bye Law 2026 was held between 26 January – 23 February 2026. A number of channels were used to publicise the consultation process and invite the submission of observations.
